LINKED! WebEOC, EMTrack andSNETS come together

Austin, TX Technical teams successfully demonstrated the linkage of the SNETS system to the WebEOC and EMTrack systems at a presentation for DSHS, TDEM and various RAC executives on January 6 in Austin. With this significant milestone, evacuees now enrolled on or seen by any of the three systems will report that information to the other systems. This new capability will be especially valuable as evacuees move into and out of hospitals, medical special needs shelters and other medical facilities.

"This demonstration shows that we are over 95% of the way toward sharing evacuee data across these systems. While there are some remaining items to be accomplished, the system is ready as-is for an event today. We are very pleased with the progress" said Ray Apodaca, DSHS, following the demonstration.
